Music, wellbeing and creativity, why it's never too late to start

We hear from Richard Keech about how music arrived in his life, when it was needed. After a difficult period that forced him to slow down and reassess, picking up an instrument became a way back. Now playing and writing regularly with his duo, R&R and soul band Circus in the Sky, based in Berwick, Richard talks openly about how music supports his wellbeing, and why creating bonds with musicians can be just as important as playing the music itself.

Despite growing up around music, I never really gravitated towards it as a younger man. I was a visual artist - painting, drawing and taking photographs. Playing music wasn't for me. In 2017, mental health difficulties had taken me out of work and I was trying to figure out how to keep dark thoughts at bay. I was dealing with a loss and grief, and honestly, didn't know where to turn. I bought a cheap ukulele from Amazon to occupy my mind, learned a handful of chords and began using those few chords along with some of my own words. The first time I played in public, I included one of my own songs. It was called Disbelief, and was about losing the house I'd grown up in losing that sense of safety. I was still recovering, still processing everything, and I

poured all of it into that song. Afterwards, people told me how much it had resonated with them; it was the first time I realised that my grief could be transformed into something beautiful. Since then, through the challenges that life throws at us, music has been a constant. Writing, playing, meeting new people, collaborating - all of it has helped me see things differently and feel stronger.

There's something really special about creating, rehearsing and performing something together. I love the small moments: harmonies finally clicking, mistakes turning into new ideas, the deep talks after rehearsals."

Music is now part of every day. Along with full-time work and family life, I juggle rehearsals with different bands. Mondays playing with, Swefn, who are newer to the community. Wednesdays are with my friend Ruth Alder-Bateman, working on our duo, R&R, laughing and talking nonsense between songs - which we then try and build into our act. And whenever we can, I'm either writing new songs with my soul brother, Iain Petrie, or rehearsing with our band, Circus in the Sky, which is always a challenge with six busy people, but always worth it.

There's something really special about creating, rehearsing and performing something together. I love the small moments: harmonies finally clicking, mistakes turning into new ideas, the deep talks after rehearsals.

Ruth and I hosting the Repas 7 Hogmanay celebrations as R&R or headlining the Berwick Food and Beer Festival with Circus In The Sky and hearing people sing our own songs back to us is something I'll never forget.

Music has completely changed my headspace: practice calms me; writing helps me process things; performing gives me energy like few things can. It's built my confidence and helped me find the life/work balance. Most importantly, it's helped me connect with so many people from all walks of life.

I was 35 when I bought a ukulele and learned my first three chords. Now I'm 43, playing live as often as I can, surrounded by a community that feels like home. What started as a way out of a dark place has become my path to happiness and connection. Creativity can carry you through hard times and that it's never too late to start.

Until recently, Berwick was one of the few local towns NOT to have a Music Society. This all changed with the launch of Berwick Music Society's first concert season in 2024.

The Society's second season has featured concerts from Berwick Brass, saxophonist Carl Raven, The Tim Kliphuis jazz trio, opera masterclass with soprano, Yvonne Barclay, art historian Maria Chester's Baroque spoken word and live music showcase with The Gal Trio, and pianist and composer, Ieva Dubova.

Berwick Music Society's mission is to celebrate the best classical and contemporary music performed by professional soloists and ensembles. Our ambition is to showcase work by composers and performers in Northumberland and the Scottish Borders as much as we can and to reach out to our local community to encourage more involvement in music. A small dedicated team work behind the scenes to make everything happen, backed by a growing number of patrons, who show their support for the town's ever-evolving musical offerings, the Community Foundation North East and the team at our wonderful venue, Berwick Parish Church.

This spring, the choir performs at Berwick Parish Church on 18 April, singing Handel's Messiah Parts 2 and 3, followed by a festive concert in the same venue on 12 December. Under the guidance of Musical Director Marion Scammell, rehearsals take place every Thursday from 7-9pm at Spittal Community Centre.

New singers are always warmly welcomed. There are no auditions and whilst reading music is helpful, a love of music, and a lot of enthusiasm matter more. The choir will also be hosting two singing workshops on 25 July and 22 August for both members and non-members, which will offer an opportunity to improve singing skills. Ultimately, The Straw Yard exists to nurture creativity, support artists, and provide audiences with memorable cultural experiences. By combining performance, production, learning, and community activity in one place, we aim to be a vibrant and sustainable centre for the arts in Berwick and the wider Borders region.

Berwick Blooms - Rooted in community, growing for the future

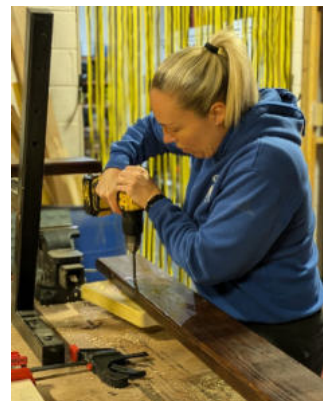
From shared planters to hidden green corners, Berwick is quietly coming into bloom for the summer. In this feature we meet Kay, who works with Berwick Town Council and takes care of planting, tending and growing spaces to bring colour to the town.

“My day starts early, usually with a cinnamon and raisin bagel and a cup of tea first thing before I head off to take care of the plants around town.

At the start of the year, in February and March, our time is all about preparation. We're cleaning and checking the baskets, getting pots ready to go back out, and organising deliveries. We've got more than 10,000 plants coming in, so you need to be organised well in advance for the months ahead.

When I'm planting, I've always got my rock playlist on and I swear the plants like it and enjoy the tunes.

In summer I'm in to work for about half five, quarter to six, as soon as there's daylight for my first job of the day, which is watering.



“And I'm proud of what we do. People notice it, residents and visitors alike and with plants the results are tangible: if you put the effort in, it shows.”

The High Street fills up quickly at this time of year, so it's best (and safest) to get the heavy work done before the crowds come and the heat of the day.

We head straight to Marygate as I want to make sure it's looking its absolute best. Hanging baskets take time, and I'm fussy. If someone is walking down the High Street who's never been to Berwick before, I want it to look clean, tidy and welcoming. We deadhead and tidy, working through the beds and baskets in the town centre, and replace anything that's struggling. In summer I keep spare plants, compost and my kit on the van, just in case I need to replace any of the flowers to keep everything looking good.

My favourite spots in town are Tweedmouth as the beds are brilliant in the summer, and I enjoy the planters at Spittal too. Berwick's a great place to work; the only frustration is seeing areas that aren't ours and thinking, “I could make that look so much better.” As I'm ex-Navy, I like routine and order: an early start, a clear plan and do it properly. What inspires me most is having a manager who understands the job and if there's a problem, you can ask a question and get a straight answer, and that support makes a huge difference.

The wellbeing benefits of making art outdoors

Ali Edwards is an illustrator and designer based in Berwick who creates hand-drawn maps and illustrations inspired by the landscapes and history of the North East and beyond. Ali also teaches a range of workshops to help inspire others to explore nature and heritage through their creativity.



Let me introduce 'Green Sketching'

My creative practice is fuelled by my love of the natural world, with much of my self-led illustration and design inspired by nature-based subjects. But actually getting outside and drawing what I can see is something I've only come to quite recently, thanks to the encouragement I found when I read 'The Green Sketching Handbook' by Dr Ali Foxon.

It's a wonderfully practical little field guide that encourages us to relax, let go of self-criticism, and rediscover the joy of being in nature. One of its key messages is that drawing isn't some rare talent handed out to a lucky few, it's a skill, and skills can be learnt, practised, and enjoyed by anyone. The drawings we make outside don't have to be beautiful, accurate, or shareable, in fact, the focus is far more on noticing nature, observing it and then sketching it, or rather the process of observational sketching, rather than the end result.

Ali Foxon was a climate scientist who started sketching as a hobby during a particularly stressful time in her life. Being a scientist, she was really interested in how sketching made her feel calmer, less stressed and less anxious – particularly when she was sketching outdoors.

So she dived in to researching why the act of drawing the natural world impacted her mental state so positively.

Why it matters - for us and for nature

There's a growing body of scientific evidence that shows time spent not just in nature, but connecting with it, has benefits for our physical, mental and emotional health and wellbeing. Conversely, being disconnected from nature has a host of negative impacts on both us and nature – we're less likely to care about something we don't notice. We know that the UK is one of the most nature-depleted countries in Europe. One in six species are now at risk of extinction, and more than half of our biodiversity has already been lost. And yet, the more we lose, the less we seem to notice. Part of the problem - even for people who consider themselves 'outdoorsy' - is that we can walk/cycle/run in nature without paying



attention to it; and we can hear a bird without consciously listening to it.

Studies have shown that the biggest impact happens when we go beyond *being in* nature and begin to more proactively *connect* with it. This is where sketching can be a powerful tool - slowing down, observing closely and recording what we notice through the physical act of sketching (rather than the super quick snap of a phone camera) begins a process of active engagement, strengthening our connection with the natural world and making us more keen to look after it. As an added bonus, strengthening our connection with nature also delivers us more personal benefits for our mental health and wellbeing.

In short, engaging actively with nature makes us happier, calmer and generally healthier, as well as making it easier for us to take decisions in our daily lives that will benefit nature (whether that means ditching the car for public transport, or installing solar panels for our roofs).

Slow down. Pick up a pencil.

Start noticing nature.

Green Sketching is such a joy-filled activity and is perfect for anyone who wants to get drawing but is constantly fighting against that little voice in their head telling them that they're 'not an artist' or

that they 'can't draw'.

In Green Sketching, we learn how to quiet that voice (and all the other noise in our heads) by focusing on simple, observational sketching exercises that help us to exist in the moment, creating without pressure. And best of all, Green Sketching gets us outdoors, noticing the nature around us and perhaps opening our eyes to things we'd never have seen previously. I warmly invite you to attend a workshop with me, if you're based in (or visiting) Northumberland or the Scottish Borders.

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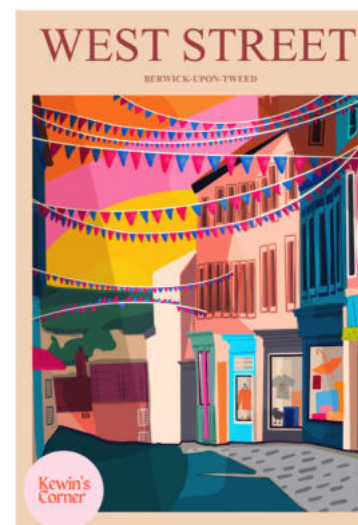

The Maltings & Living Barracks Project

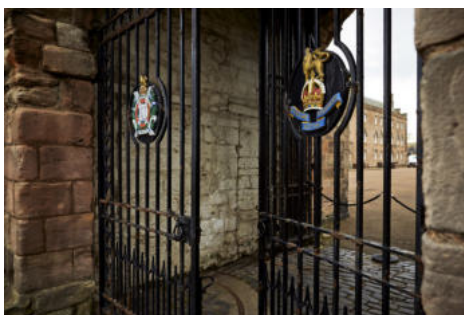
Arts and culture have always been part of Berwick-upon-Tweed's character, shaped by its history, landscape and community. A key champion of this creativity is The Maltings (Berwick) Trust, a creative cultural organisation presenting exhibitions, film, creative activity and events across a number of venues in the town, offering something to discover throughout the year.

As a registered charity, The Maltings works to make arts and culture welcoming and accessible, creating opportunities for people of all ages to experience and take part in. From exhibitions and cinema at Berwick Barracks and the Granary Gallery to creative workshops at Maltings at Hide Hill, its programme reaches across the town, inviting you to explore culture in different settings.

Visitors might step into an exhibition within a historic building, discover a new artist, or enjoy a film just a short walk from the river or town walls. Each space offers its own atmosphere, but together they form a connected cultural programme that continues to grow.

A part of this is the Living Barracks project at Berwick Barracks.

The Maltings (Berwick) Trust, along with Berwick Barracks Heritage Trust (BBHT), English Heritage (EH), The King's Own Scottish Borderers Association (KOSB) and Northumberland County Council and supported by Arts Council England's Cultural Development Fund, The National Lottery Heritage Fund and other generous partners, are working together to restore the Barracks' historic role as a central part of the town's social and cultural life, creating a vibrant destination where heritage and creativity meet.



Within this partnership, the Maltings plays a key role in animating the site through exhibitions, screenings and events, ensuring that heritage and creativity sit side by side. As more areas of the barracks open up, the space will evolve into a lively, welcoming destination for residents and visitors alike. And it's not just in the venues. The Maltings is working with artists, communities and partners to create a programme that feels both aspiring and welcoming - from nationally recognised exhibitions to family-friendly activities and opportunities for young people to get involved. This reflects a growing confidence in Berwick as a cultural destination, where creativity sits naturally alongside heritage and landscape.

"The aim is simple: to make culture accessible for everyone"



The Maltings are playing their role in bringing these elements together, helping to create reasons to visit whilst bringing the local community into the heart of its work.

As the Living Barracks project develops and activity across the town continues to expand, there is a clear sense of momentum.
